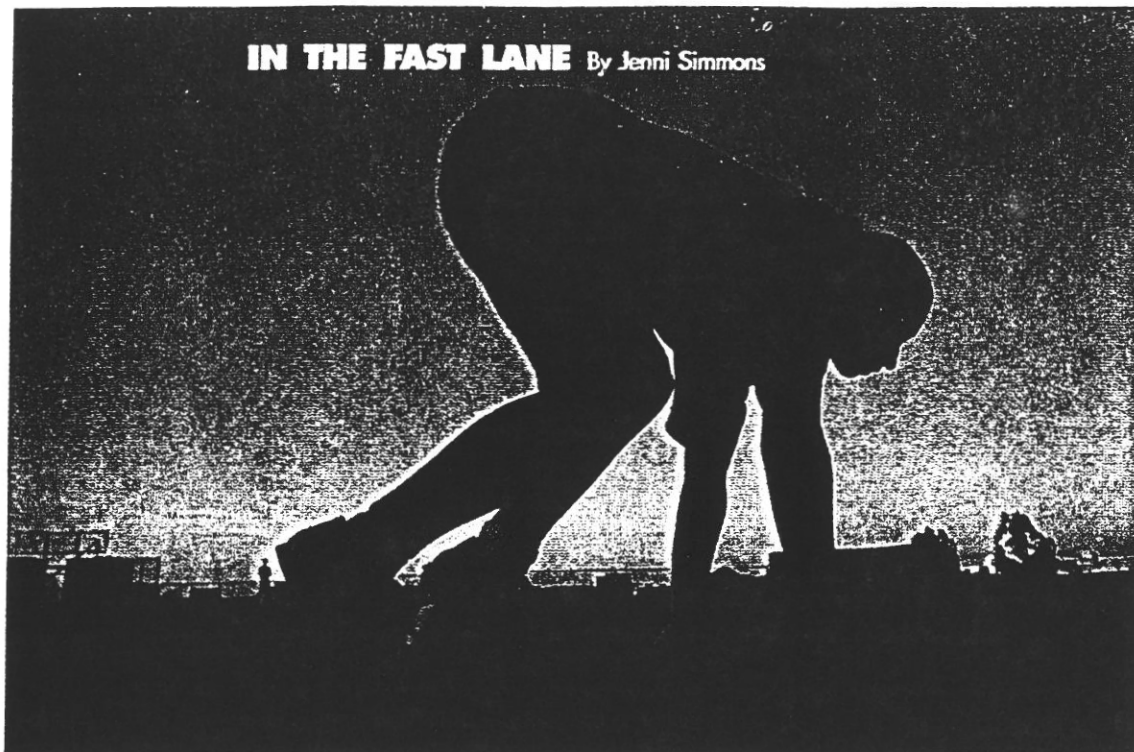

"Runners! Take your blocks," yells the official. I take a deep breath. The crisp air fills my lungs. I set my blocks to where they feel the most comfortable. I focus on the red track ahead. The sun is beating down on my head, and sweat rolls down my face. I hear the crowd yelling cheers of excitement.

"Set!" My heart feels like it's going to

pound out of my chest. One-one thousand, two-one thousand—**BANG!**

At that very second, I exert every burst of energy I possess. My legs reach for every extra inch I can get to take the lead. I come around the final corner, and I take a deep breath.

I hear the runner behind me, nipping at my heels. I drive my legs and pump my arms. I pull with everything I have.

I see the finish tape. My heart pounds faster and faster. The runner behind me is fading, and I push even harder.

I cross the tape first.

Gradually I slow down. The tape has wrapped itself around my legs. I reach down, pull it up and give it back to the official. I look to the sidelines and see my dad. His glowing smile is filled with pride. He's almost crying.

In short sprints, Franklin turns to Long

Erica Long had the potential to be a very good high school sprinter. Franklin track coach Tim Leonard knew that last season, when Long displayed flashes of excellence as a freshman.

"I thought the possibility was there," Leonard said. "But you never know how good somebody is going to be."

"I didn't know how good she was going to be this year." He knows now.

Barely halfway through her sophomore season, Long is Johnson County's — and the Mid-State Conference's — undisputed ruler of the 100- and 200-meter dashes.

Long, who holds school records in both events, has collected 16 blue ribbons in individual races this year — eight each in the 100 and 200 dashes.

Last Tuesday, Long took firsts in those races at the Mid-State Conference Meet — just like she did the previous week at the Johnson County Meet.

"It's been a pleasant surprise," Leonard said of Long's string of success. "Last year was really a learning experience for her. Being around some good seniors who had a good work ethic rubbed off on her."

"She started to realize if she wanted to do well, she'd have to work hard to get the most out of what she's got."

The hard work has paid off.

Long, who ran cross country last fall to build stamina for track, owns school records in the 100 and 200 with respective times of 12.35 seconds and 25.68 seconds.

She also has the Mid-State Conference record in the 100 with a time of 12.5 seconds.

"My times are getting better as the season goes on," said Long, who set the new school standards in the 100 and 200 during Thursday's three-way meet against Roncalli and Beech Grove.

Long, who is one of several young gifted athletes responsible for Franklin's 8-1 record, is keeping her accomplishments in perspective.

"I'm confident, but I can't let it get to my head," she said. "There

are other people out there who are fast. I'm not the fastest person."

"I always expect the worst and try my best."

Long learned from the best last year, running in the wake of graduated teammate Sarah Craciunoiu.

Craciunoiu, a dominating sprinter in her own right, routinely finished ahead of Long in races last year — until Leonard took Craciunoiu out of the 200 and re-inserted her in the 400-meter dash.

That move, Leonard said, allowed Long to win some races in the 200 and start building confidence.

"Erica kind of ran in (Craciunoiu's) shadow a little bit," Leonard said. "She really started to come around at about this time last season when she started to get more confidence."

As Long's confidence grew, so did her desire to get better.

"I really got into track this year," said Long, who admits she had no idea her sophomore season would be so sensational. "I didn't know what to expect, but I had my goals."

"Everything is falling into place." Although distances are not Long's

specialty, she took up cross country last fall to condition herself for the spring.

"I'm not very good at it, but it helped me," said Long, who also anchors Franklin's 400 relay team. "It built up my speed and my stamina."

Long isn't the only Grizzly Cub enjoying a remarkable season.

Sophomore distance runner Amy Stenger and freshman sprinter Carrie Reese also won blue ribbons at the conference meet. Freshman Michelle Cummings is a routine winner in hurdles, as is freshman

Andrea White in the long jump.

Junior Brooke Clarkston, sophomore Stacy Blotch and freshmen Courtney Clarkston and Brooke McClure have fueled Franklin's 400 and 1,600 relay teams. "The exciting thing for us is, most are freshmen and sophomores," Leonard said.

Long and her teammates are certainly having fun.

"We have a great team. A lot of runners have a lot of things going for them," she said. "They just have to put their minds to it, and they can do just about anything they want."

Girls track

Host Franklin ran its season record to 8-1 with a victory in a three-way meet against Roncalli and Beech Grove.

The Grizzly Cubs cruised by Roncalli 80-45. Beech Grove was last with 22 points.

Sophomore Erica Long set a pair of school records in the 100- and 200-meter dashes with respective times of 12.35 seconds and 25.68 seconds.

Sophomore Amy Stenger also won a pair of races in the 800- and 1,600-meter runs.

Freshman Michelle Cummings took firsts in the 100- and 300-meter hurdles. Freshman Carrie Reese won the 400-meter dash for the Grizzly Cubs.

The Franklin girls track team ended a splendid dual meet season with a second-place showing Thursday at Seymour.

Columbus North won the meet with 74½ points to Franklin's 42. Seymour totaled 31½.

The meet marked the first time in coach Tim Leonard's 10-year stint that the girls defeated Seymour.

And the 10-2 dual meet record is the best during his tenure. The team is off until Tuesday's sectional meet at Columbus East.

Freshman Carrie Reese won the 400-meter dash in 1:01 and sophomore Erika Long won the 200-meters in :26.4.

County teams fare well in sectional

Center Grove's consistently strong girls track team posted 103 points to earn a second-place finish Tuesday night at the sectional tournament at Columbus East.

Host Columbus East came out on top with 146, and Columbus North placed third with 94.

Center Grove's winning 1,600-meter relay team of Jenny Martin, Kristen Hoopes, Amanda McLaughlin and Nicole Marlin tied the sectional record, set by Columbus East last year.

Martin, a sophomore, turned in the Trojans' only solo sectional title, winning the long jump by more than a foot with a leap of 16 feet, 9½ inches.

"A foot is a pretty big difference," said Martin, who turned in her second-best career jump. "It's real unusual. Regional competition will be a lot tougher."

Besides the exceptional performances of Martin and the relay team, several other Trojans enjoyed a fine evening.

Coach Carol Tumey cited the examples of McLaughlin and Marlin.

"Amanda McLaughlin did a fantastic job in the 300-meter hurdles, and Nicole Marlin broke the 26 (second) mark," Tumey said. "And our distance runners got their best times this year."

Franklin's team turned in its best-ever sectional performance with a fourth-place finish at the tournament. The Grizzly Cubs tallied a team-record 53 sectional points and had three individual championships among its team-record nine regional qualifiers.

The top four finishers in each event advance to the regionals.

"I couldn't be happier," Franklin coach Tim Leonard said. "This is the best we've ever done in the sectionals."

"In my years of coaching, this is the most points we've had, the highest we've placed and the most people we've sent on to regionals."

Franklin sophomore Erica Long kicked off the winning for the Cubs by tying the 100-meter dash sectional record with a time of 12.6 seconds.

In the 200-meter dash, Long turned in a repeat performance,

this time calling the record all her own. Her time of 25.7 seconds broke the previous sectional mark of 26 seconds set by Columbus East's Tameka McNeil last year.

In both the 100 and 200, Long raced against a strong Center Grove competitor, Marlin.

Although Marlin, a sophomore, false started in the 100 preliminaries, she placed second in the 200, turning in her fastest time of the year and breaking the 26-second mark.

"I was feeling pretty tight tonight, and I was nervous," Long said. "Nicole gave me a run for my money."

Long has plenty of local company heading into next week's regional tournament at Shelbyville. In all, 23 Johnson County athletes will be competing.

"We've got a lot of good girls going to the regionals," Long said. "I think we're all going to do pretty good. We've all got our hearts into it."

For Edinburgh, senior Vicki Hammond placed first in the shot put and second in discus.

The only other sectional winner from Johnson County was freshman Carrie Reese, who captured the 400 run for Franklin.

"This makes it all worthwhile," Leonard said. "You don't have to win sectionals to have a great sectional."
