For those that don't know, the awards podium was built in 2009 as an Eagle Scout project by FCOMM XC alumni runner, and current Trine University runner J.D. Morris. The bridge that you will cross to and from the course was built in 2011 as an Eagle Scout project by current FCOMM runner Skyler Lykins.

2010 Results:

Franklin girls came in second last year finishing behind Plainfield and ahead of (in order) Whiteland, Martinsville, Greenwood, Mooresville and Decatur Central.

Franklin boys ran to a second place finish behind Martinsville, for the second year in a row. We were followed by (again, in order) Plainfield, Greenwood, Whiteland, Mooresville and Decatur Central.

Course Description:

The course is a gently rolling circuit course carved from the flood plain, corn fields, and woods east of the school. Sole access to the course is across the foot bridge (many thanks to Sklyer Lykins as the bridge was constructed as his Eagle Scout project) at the base of the hill below the auditorium parking lot, immediately adjacent to the awards podium (many thanks to Franklin Alumni runner J.D. Morris as the podium was constructed as his Eagle Scout project).

As you cross the bridge, you are entering the course at its north/south midpoint. The start/finish area lies immediately in front of you, with the start lines and finish lines to your left (north). As you follow the mowed path to the east to reach the mowed spectator areas you will cross the start/finish area and the last leg of the inner course loop.

You might want to read this with the course map in hand.

Start and outer loop going north: Runners start near the north end of the course, and proceed south through the wide, 450 meter long starting stretch adjacent to the creek on the west side of the course. Here, they take a sweeping, 180 degree turn to the north and run the rolling 650 meter long eastern perimeter of the course, passing the 1K mark as they near the turn at Branigan Road.

Branigan, the diagonal and outer loop going south: A quick left turns them west along Branigan Road, the northern boundary of the course. 70 meters later and two quick lefts send them back towards the outer loop, in the opposite direction. They pass the 1-mile mark as they reenter the outer loop, now running south along the eastern boundary of the course.

<u>Woods:</u> As runners approach the opening turn, they bypass the turn and run west into the woods portion of the course. Here, a drainage ditch and some quick turns along the creek make for a strategic 200 meters of running. Halfway through the woods on this first loop, runners pass the 2K-mark.

<u>Inner loop:</u> Runners next exit the woods heading east and are greeted with the sweeping uphill turn to the north into the inner loop. Here, they proceed north through a swale or two as they parallel the outer loop path. After running north for 270 meters they enter another sweeping 180-degree turn sending them back to the south for the center leg of the inner loop. A quick, 200 meter straightaway leads them into the last 180-degree hairpin, with an uphill entry but a nice downhill exit into the western leg of the inner loop. Here they will be running north, immediately adjacent to the start/finish area. Runners pass the 3K-mark just as they pass the finish on their left (tantalizingly close).

<u>Diagonal</u>, <u>Branigan</u> and <u>outer loop going south (again)</u>: As they pass 3K, runners join the diagonal that takes them northwest to run along the Branigan Road loop in the opposite direction that they ran earlier. After the first right hand turn they pass the 2-mile mark, two more right-hand turns in 150 meters and they're back on the outer loop path heading south along the eastern perimeter of the course.

<u>The woods, and inner loop (second pass):</u> Runners follow the full 450-meter long eastern edge of the course and pass the 4K-mark as they enter the woods for the second time. From here, they follow their previous path through the woods and into the inner loop.

<u>The finish:</u> As they come through the second hairpin in the inner loop, they slide to the left into the finish chute, hugging the eastern side of the start/finish area a flat, fast 200 meters brings them to the finish line.

Viewing Suggestions:

Forget the running shoes – with very little walking you can view the runners passing you multiple times.

Best suggestions. If you stay in the southern spectator bubbles (tent boy lingo for mowed areas) just across from the bridge, you can see the runners 9 times just by moving east and west across the inner loop.

If you want to be close to the start/finish line, proceed north to the spectator bubble by the 3K-mark. Here, without moving more than 25 meters you will see the runners start, pass you 4 times and then see the finish.

For more private yelling coaching or cheering of your favorite runners, you can go to the spectator bubble to the north of the start line, you'll be able to see the start from behind the line and watch them race down the opening stretch, then have them pass you 4 times in the diagonal and Branigan Road loops.

Tent boy suggestion, for best viewing with the least amount of running/walking move east/west not north/south.

Some course etiquette, we have ropes up to keep spectators off the course and allow runners to race unimpeded. Please respect the ropes and don't hesitate to ask others to do the same.

Random Tent Boy Thoughts

- There will be a lot of work to do to run the meet. Painting lines, manning the ropes to mark off the loops, keeping the crowd out of the start/finish area, etc. If you 'd like to help see coach Ahaus.
- Rumor has it that tent boy Gary Gamboa is back from tent-boy vacation and is going to make an appearance at this meet.
